Opinion

We have audited the financial statements of Silcoa Limited ("the Company") for the year ended 31 March 2024 which comprise the Statement of comprehensive income, the Statement of changes in equity, the Statement of financial position and the notes to the financial statements, including a summary of significant accounting policies. The financial reporting framework that has been applied in their preparation is applicable law and United Kingdom Accounting Standards, including Financial Reporting Standard 102 The Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland (United Kingdom Generally Accepted Accounting Practice).

Notes to the financial statements for the year ended 31 March 2024

1 Accounting policies

Silcoa Limited is a private company limited by shares incorporated in England and Wales under Companies Act 2006. The address of the registered office is Bryer Ash Business Park, Bradford Road, Trowbridge, BA14 8RT. The nature of the company's operations and its principal activity during the year was the provision of repairs and maintenance services to Selwood Housing properties.

The financial statements have been prepared under the historical cost convention and in accordance with Section 1A of FRS102 the Financial Reporting Standard applicable in the UK and Republic of Ireland and Companies Act 2006.

Basis of accounting

As of 1 July 2021 the trade and assets and liabilities of Silcoa Limited were fully transferred to the parent company, Selwood Housing.

The following principal accounting policies have been applied:

Turnover

Turnover is the value of services supplied exclusive of value added tax and is recognised when work is completed.

Pension costs

Contributions to the company's defined contribution pension scheme are charged to the statement of comprehensive income in the period in which they become payable. The assets of the scheme are held separately in an independently administered fund.

Financial instruments

The company only enters into basic financial instruments transactions that result in the recognition of financial assets and liabilities like trade and other debtors and creditors, loans from banks and other third parties and loans to related parties.

Debt instruments (other than those wholly repayable or receivable within one year), including loans and other accounts receivable and payable, are initially measured at present value of the future cash flows and subsequently at amortised cost using the effective interest method. Debt instruments that

Accounting policies (continued)

are payable or receivable within one year, typically trade debtors and creditors, are measured, initially and subsequently, at the undiscounted amount of the cash or other consideration expected to be paid or received. However, if the arrangements of a short-term instrument constitute a financing transaction, like the payment of a trade debt deferred beyond normal business terms or financed at a rate of interest that is not a market rate or in case of an out-right short-term loan not at market rate, the financial asset or liability is measured, initially, at the present value of the future cash flow discounted at a market rate of interest for a similar debt instrument and subsequently at amortised cost.

Financial assets that are measured at cost and amortised cost are assessed at the end of each reporting period for objective evidence of impairment. If objective evidence of impairment is found, an impairment loss is recognised in the statement of comprehensive income.

For financial assets measured at amortised cost, the impairment loss is measured as the difference between an asset's carrying amount and the present value of estimated cash flows discounted at the asset's original effective interest rate. If a financial asset has a variable interest rate, the discount rate for measuring any impairment loss is the current effective interest rate determined under the contract.

For financial assets measured at cost less impairment, the impairment loss is measured as the difference between an asset's carrying amount and best estimate of the recoverable amount, which is an approximation of the amount that the company would receive for the asset if it were to be sold at the reporting date.

Financial assets and liabilities are offset, and the net amount reported in the statement of financial position when there is an enforceable right to set off the recognised amounts and there is an intention to settle on a net basis or to realise the asset and settle the liability simultaneously.

Qualifying Charitable Donations

The company is a subsidiary of a charitable registered provider of social housing and intends to make qualifying charitable donations of an amount equal to the taxable profits to charities within the Selwood Housing group within nine months of the year end in each financial year. As these amounts represent distributions, they are recognized in the company's reserves in the year in which they are declared.

Accounting policies (continued)

A tax charge and liability will not be recognised in relation to the taxable profits of the subsidiaries where a gift aid payment within nine months of the year end is probable.

Cash and cash equivalents

Cash and cash equivalents consist of cash at bank and deposits with an original maturity of 95 days or less.

2 Judgements in applying accounting policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty

In preparing the financial statements the directors do not consider they have made any material judgements. There are no significant sources of estimation uncertainty.

The Group's financial statements have been prepared on a going concern basis which assumes an ability to continue operating for the foreseeable future. No significant concerns have been noted in the business plan updated

Judgements in applying accounting policies and key sources of estimation uncertainty (continued)

for 2023/24 and therefore we consider it appropriate to continue to prepare the financial statements on a going concern basis

3 Directors' remuneration

The directors received no remuneration from the company during the year. All directors are remunerated by Selwood Housing Society Limited, the company's parent.

13 Ultimate parent undertaking and controlling party

The company's immediate and ultimate parent undertaking and controlling party is Selwood Housing Society Limited. Selwood Housing Society Limited is the parent of both the smallest and largest groups into which the company's financial statements are consolidated.
